2022 VIRCHOW PRIZE LAUREATE

JOHN N. NKENGASONG

Inaugural laureate of the 2022 Virchow Prize for Global Health, John Nkengasong, was awarded for his outstanding and significant lifetime contributions towards strengthening global health. His unparalleled commitment to addressing complex health challenges, his development of systemic and holistic approaches which have fundamentally shaped the global health landscape, and mobilisation towards the attainment of the United Nations 2030 Agenda Sustainable Development Goals and "health and wellbeing for all" made him a deserving laureate of the Virchow Prize for Global Health.

EMPOWERING VULNERABLE AND DISPLACED POPULATIONS IN CAMEROON THROUGH THE VIRCHOW PRIZE DONATION OF 500,00 EUROS (EVDP) REPORT

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The "Empowering Vulnerable and Displaced Populations in Cameroon through the Virchow Prize Donation of 500,000 Euros" project was implemented in collaboration with the Ministry of Public Health, and the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Civic Education, Cameroon. The project empowered vulnerable and displaced adolescent girls and boys, as well as young women and men in the conflict-stricken Northwest and Southwest regions of Cameroon. The project, covering the period from April to November 2023, focused on three main objectives.


The project also included the development of a scholarship programme, job placement assistance and networking and professional development to support the educational and economic empowerment of vulnerable individuals.

There were tangible improvements in access to education and vocational skills contributing to the overall well-being and prospects of the beneficiaries.

In conclusion, the project has made significant strides in addressing the multifaceted challenges faced by internally displaced populations.
